OUTLINE OF THE CAREER OF SIR FRANK YOUNG

Final George Young was born in London on 25 March 1909. He was educated at Alleyin's School, Deleted 1916-1959 and then entered University College London. He graduated in chemistry and physics in 1939 and wort or to postgraduate work in biochemistry and physiology at University College under J.C. Drummond, C. Lovatt Evans and A.V. Hill. After one year 1900-1933 as an Noncerary Assistant in the Department of Physiology at University College, Young held research fellowships successively at the University of Adenders under J.J.R. Aldred and the University of Tomono under C.H. Best, studying debiters. He returned to University College in 1935 before in 1180 being appointed to the Scientific Start of the Medical Research Council's National Institute for Medical Research, under the Directoring of Str Herry Date.

In 1942 Young was appointed Professor of Bachamistry at St Thomas's Hospital Medical School, University of London and three years later was appointed to the Char in Bochamistry at University College London. Young left London in 1948, when he was appointed Sir William Dunn Professor of Biochemistry at Cambridge, succeeding A.C. Ochmall. He retired from the Chair in 1975. On moving to Cambridge Young was made a Fellow of Timby Hab Lan the selegand the Fellowship in 1964 when he became the first Master of Darwin Collega, the newly founded Cambridge postpractuate offices. He stood down from the Masterhoin in 1979.

Young devoted much of his time to service with national and international bodies. In the UK his was a member of the Medical Research Council 1950-1964, served on the Executive Council of the Clas Foundation from 1954 to 1977 (appointed Chiarman of the Council and Trustae in 1967) and was a co-founder of the Bittish Naudision Foundation in 1967 (serving as President 1970-1970). Young served on a number of government advisory bodies including the Committee on Medical Appost of Food Policy 1957-1980, and the Advisory Committee on the Irradiation of Food from 1967 (as Chiarman). He was also a member of the Regol Commission on Medical Education 1955-1986. International Committee Council of the International Committee Council of Scientific Unions 1970-1972 (Treasure 1967-1972) and the Esecutive Board of the International Council of Scientific Unions 1970-1974 (Vice-President 1970-1972). Young was particularly active in diabetes research of the Bittish Debené Association from databetes research of the Bittish Debené Association from

1948, President of the European Association for the Study of Diabetes 1965-1968, and President of the International Diabetes Federation 1970-1973.

Young received numerous honours and awards, many from oversess, including the Barring Mamorial Medial of the American Diabetes Association in 1900 and the Upphin Award of the US Endotrine Society in 1963. He was elected to the Feltowship of the Royal Society in 1949 (Croonian Lecture 1962) and kinghted in 1976.

Young's principal research contribution was in the field of endocrinology, with particular reference to the study of diabetes. In autobiographical notes composed in September 1976 (A.6) Young described his work as follows:

In 1807 he described a new method of including experimental diabetes in animals by the administration of an extract of the antance plustary gland for a short time, later showing that the persistence of the diabete condition was caused by damage to the inscriproducing casts of the parcreatic steht and that the causathie agent was enterior plustary growth homones. These investigations have been described as "home of the classical experiments in anoticinology", which his collaborators he developed the view that diabetes melitas can constitues originate from an intellation between the actions of insulin and growth homone with respect to the utilization of glacone, a secondary result of this inflation being diamego in the purchase listed on the process called the size.

Young did little laboratory work himself after 1945 and effectively cassed active research when he came to Cambridge, although from the late 1950s he oversaw work on growth hormone, undertaken with a sochnician D.C. Gartiewa.

Young died on 20 September 1988.

DESCRIPTION OF THE COLLECTION

The material is presented in the order given in the Lit of Contents. It covers the paried 1975-1988. Much of the material particularly Young's research papers, was found in very poor condition and preliminary conservation work notwell-betterding, significant quantities of material could not be preserved and had to be discarded. Much of what has been retained requires careful handling as many documents are in fragile condition. Section A, Biographical, includes a little subbingraphical material including full curricula vitas. There is considerable material including to Young's knighthood, chelly letters of congraduation. The section asic includes a little family material, some personal correspondence and material installing to Young's historical interests.

Section R, University of Chartridge, is disappointing plant Young's contributions to the Department of Biochemistry, the development of modicine in Carbridge and his Masterenhip of Darwin College, it includes documentation of Young's teaching in the Department of Blochemistry, some departmental administration material and a little material relating to the development of the Clinical School and to arrangements for the post-instrument research. Section H, Correspondence, includies general scientific correspondence presented in alphabetical order. Principal correspondents include C.H. Beet, J. Bornsten, Sir Hanry Dale, I. Hais, W.D. Tigett and Lond Zuckerman. There is also Young's letter life of outgoing letters, January - September 1976, and some references and secommendations.

The material in this section is paticly coverage of Young's research from 1829 to the 1970s.
