This section documents Lonsdale's foreign and domestic travel, 1943-1971. It is arranged in chronological order.

In February 1964 the Council moved to alter the College's Charter to allow it to accept male students. Sixty governors, including Lonsdale strongly, though unsuccessfully, opposed the move partly on constitutional grounds.
