# GENERAL INTRODUCTION

For an outline of the career of Sir Peter Markham Scott see 'Catalogue of the papers and correspondence of Sir Peter Markham Scott' compiled in 1999 (NCUACS catalogue 87/8/99).

## PROVENANCE

The papers were received for cataloguing from Cambridge University Library in 2003.

## DESCRIPTION OF THE COLLECTION

This catalogue of papers of Sir Peter Markham Scott is a supplement to that compiled in 1999 (NCUACS 87/8/99). Additional papers have been found for Section A (Biographical), Section C (Nature conservation and research) and Section E (Publications). They have been arranged and numbered to follow the sequence of the previous catalogue, which should therefore be consulted in conjunction with this catalogue.

Section A, Biographical, consists of press cuttings. There are two general press-cuttings books and the contents of a wrapper of loose press cuttings, covering the period, 1972-1984. Topics include Scott himself, the Wildfowl Trust, Slimbridge and the World Wildlife Fund. There are also three Loch Ness Monster press-cuttings books covering the period 1975-1984.

Section C, Nature conservation and research, presents important documentation of two organisations with which Scott was closely associated in key roles: the Charles Darwin Foundation for the Galapagos Islands (CDF) and the International Union for the Protection of Nature (IUPN) / International Union for the Conservation of Nature and Natural Resources (IUCN). The CDF papers cover the period 1960-1979. They include correspondence, committee papers, reports and photographs on such topics as funding, construction of the research station, provision of research vessels, scientific and conservation work on the Galapagos, relations with Ecuadorean authorities, and tourism in the Galapagos. Scott's correspondents include Presidents and Secretaries General of the Foundation, members of the Executive Committee, financial supporters and Directors of the Charles Darwin Research Station, for example David Snow and Roger Perry. There are IUPN papers from 1955, just before the name change in 1956, and IUCN papers from the period 1960-1966. The IUCN papers are arranged in an alphabetical sequence of correspondents including Secretaries

General and Presidents of the IUCN. Topics include IUCN and Survival Service Commission policy and organisation.

Section E, Publications, consists of undated figures, principally of ducks, geese and swans, for one or more publications. The great bulk of the material is presented in an alphabetical sequence by species of duck or goose (Barnacle Goose, Canada Goose, Eider Duck etc).

There is also an index of correspondents.

#### C.1348-C.1444 CHARLES DARWIN FOUNDATION FOR THE 1960-1979 GALAPAGOS ISLANDS (CDF)

The CDF was set up by the International Union for the Conservation of Nature and Natural Resources (IUCN) and UNESCO in 1959. CDF scientists and supporters began building the Charles Darwin Research Station (CDRS) in 1960 on National Park land on Santa Cruz Island. It was formally inaugurated in 1964. Scott was one of the founders of the CDF, served as a member of its Executive Committee and was actively engaged in its activities over many years.

Scott's CDF papers were found in both named individual and year files. They comprise correspondence, committee papers, reports, etc relating to funding, construction of research station, provision of research vessels, scientific and conservation work on the Galapagos, relations with Ecuadorean authorities, tourism in the Galapagos, etc.

Scott's correspondents include Presidents and Secretaries General of the Foundation, members of the Executive Committee, financial supporters, Directors of the Charles Darwin Research Station (David Snow, Roger Perry), etc.

The IUPN was established in 1948 after an international conference at Fontainebleau, France. The organisation changed its name to the International Union for the Conservation of Nature and Natural Resources in 1956.

Scott became a member of the IUCN Survival Service Commission (SSC) in 1962 and was Chairman from 1963.
