Swann was made a Life Peer in 1981. He was a frequent attender and speaker from the cross-benches of the House of Lords, particularly on matters relating to education, scientific research and broadcasting. '[He] proved a quiet but devastating critic of government educational policy and above all, perhaps, of the language civil servants used in making what was said to be the necessary enquiries on which to base policy. Swann did not find these parliamentary speeches easy to deliver ... but they deserve to last' (Lord Briggs, *The Guardian*, 24 September 1990, as quoted by J.M. Mitchison in 'Michael Meredith Swann', *Biographical Memoirs of the Royal Society* 37, 1991, 457).

Swann took an active part in opposing elements of the Bill. Those provisions that affected universities were widely perceived within the higher education community as representing a threat to the independence of universities.
